



## Sitrep -1: Flood Incident in Assam 10<sup>th</sup> July, 2013

### A. SITUATION REPORT:

The Brahmaputra and its tributaries are already in full spate and their water levels have been reported to be rising following incessant rain for the last few days. A total of 259 villages in 11 districts have been affected till date due to the rainfall led surge in the Brahmaputra and its tributaries. The people living along the banks have been badly affected by the flood. The affected people have been shifted to relief camps set up by the government.

- 15 plus schools and 25 ICDSM centers have been submerged and are presently not functional. Educational materials damaged.
  - The Panchayats office has been severely inundated.
  - The road connecting NH-32 to Sangajan Ghat has washed away at about 150 meters. Transportation is not easily available in that area.
  - There is a possibility of an outbreak of water-borne and vector-borne diseases.
  - Scarcity of pure drinking water.
  - Due to severe flood, most of the roads and PMGSY schemes have been damaged/affected.
  - Several roads are either partially or fully submerged. Several road embankments have been eroded and approaches of bridge and culverts are washed away by the flood water.
2. Golagath- 6 roads, 1 bridge and 3 culverts damaged.
  3. Karimganj- Embankment breached at Madanpur (R K Nanagar) & Chandpur (Patharkandi)

## C. RESPONSE from Government and Humanitarian Agencies:

- The government has set up the relief camps and distributed rice, dal and salt in the relief camps.
- The administration has kept ready the State Disaster Response Force (SDRF) as well as NDRF in Dhemaji District.
- The NGO fieldworkers are in the field to collect updated information and make needs assessment.
- The IAG-Assam held an Emergency Meeting on 5<sup>th</sup> July 2013.

## D. IMMEDIATE NEEDS:

- There is an immediate need for health camp and tarpaulin in Lakhimpur district and Dhemaji District.
- Assessment of the affected population is required.
