After experiencing rainfall, sudden flash flood has hit around 40 villages in Moradabad district, UP. The main connecting roads with the Moradabad city have been submerged by flash flood and the lives of seven people have been claimed dead.

Sitrep: Traumatic Flood and Landslide Situation in Uttarakhand 17th July, 2014

A. SITUATION REPORT UTTARAKHAND:

Following the heavy downpour, the Kedar valley of district Rudraprayag and many tributaries of river Mandakini has been flooded and leading to landslide in Uttarakhand. The main highway to Kedarnath and also other roads have been blocked; majority of the district Rudraprayg was cut off from the rest of the world. In some of places, river water had submerged the habitation. The Indian Metrological Department has been forecasting a heavy to very heavy rainfall in the isolated place of Uttarakhad from the past few days and on the following days.

B. IMPACT OF THE SITUATION:

- Many pilgrims are stranded in Gangotri after the road to Uttarkashi caved in at many places due to landslide and heavy rainfall.
- The Char Dham Yatra to Kedarnath has been suspended and the region has been put on highly alert for safety reason till 18th July, 2014.
- The National Highway in the Kedar valley has been inundated with water at two places between Chamoli to Shrinagar.
- The Road connecting Kedarnath- Gaurikund and The Rishikesh-Badrinath national highway (NH) have been blocked due to the heavy rainfall and landslide.
- Landslides have been reported in Lambagarh, Chirobagadh and Vijaynagar near Augustmuni in Chamoli.
- No loss of life and property being reported.

Sitrep: Depression over North East Odisha and Adjoining area of West Bengal 21st July, 2014

A. SITUATION REPORT ODISHA:

Yesterday's low pressure area over North Bay of Bengal and adjoining areas of Gangetic West Bengal and Odisha has rapidly concentrated into a Depression and lay centered at 0830 hours IST today, the 21st July, 2014 over Northeastern parts of Odisha and adjoining areas of Gangetic West Bengal near Lat. 22° N and Long. 87° E about 50 kms east of Baripada. The system would move West-Northwestwards during next 24 hours.

B. CURRENT SITUATION

- Isolated extremely heavy fall with heavy to very heavy rainfall would occur at one or two places over interior odisha and heavy to very heavy rainfall would occur at one or two places over coastal odisha during next 24 hours.
- **General forecast:-** rain/thundershower would occur at most places over odisha.
- **Farmers weather bulletin:-** moderate to rather heavy rain/thundershower would occur at most places over the districts of odisha.
- **Outlook:-** decrease in rainfall
- Max. R/h=100% and min. R/h=48%, rainfall=33.6 mm, sunrise=05:21, sunset=18:32.
- **Fishermen warning:-** strong and gusty surface wind speed reaching 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph from south westerly direction may prevail along and off odisha coast. Sea condition will be very rough. fishermen are advised not to venture into the sea.
