The strategic outreach of 155 full members includes key nodal organizations from UN, INGOs, National NGOs, CSR, Academic Institutions, Sector Networks, Expert Individuals, and State IAGs/Networks. The local outreach is evolving with 805 associate members as Sphere India Locally Empowered Organisations Network (LEON) and 1,80,000 community volunteers (CDRF -Community Disaster Response Force) mapped for varied capacities all over India. Sphere India facilitates multi stakeholder coordination, knowledge & capacity sharing and collaborative advocacy for enhancing accountability to affected and at-risk population.

Real time Inter Agency Feedback Mechanism with a call center approach is integrated in Unified Response SOP. Institutionalization of Real-time Feedback Mechanism was successfully implemented for following disasters:

Rights In Crisis and Inclusive Damage/Loss Assessment



Inclusive Damage and loss assessments: The report on the YAAS Damage and Loss Assessment was developed. List of affected families was also shared with OSDMA.

Damage Assessment & Cause Identification Study in 4 States with NIDM: Study on assessing physical, environmental and economic damages due to cyclones Tauktae and Yaas and identifying the damages has been completed.



INTER AGENCY COORDINATION

EMERGENCY RESPONSE



- **Situation Reports:** 105 Situation Reports released on COVID-19, Flood, Heavy Rainfall, Landslides, Cyclones, Viral fever and Lightning.
- **Alerts and Warnings:** 300+ Alerts on heavy rainfall, lightning, flood & cyclones were disseminated via WhatsApp, URS groups & social media.
- **Monthly Humanitarian Snapshot Reports:** Prepared and disseminated for all 9 months with infographic overview of geography-wise hazards, humanitarian responses, and loss & damage data in India.
- **Joint Rapid Needs Assessments:** 10 Joint Needs Assessments (JNA/JRNA/JENA) carried out with a special focus on vulnerable population. 1 Joint Disaster Needs Assessments (JDNA) carried out for Kerala Floods.

MULTISECTOR COORDINATION HANDBOOKS



Sphere India in partnership with NIDM, launched the Handbooks on Multi-Sector Coordination for Emergency Preparedness for Response in six sectors - education, health, food and nutrition security, WASH, shelter, and protection to strengthen preparedness and unified emergency response.

KNOWLEDGE AND CAPACITY SHARING

COVID 19 Academy is a capacity building initiative with a mission to build capacities of frontline volunteers and outreach workers across India in COVID-19 preparedness and response. In its first 3 phases, the academy was able to reach to around 1.40 Lakh participants through 276 National and State level sessions.



Development of Training Modules: Training modules on Disability Inclusive DRR, Eco DRR and Animal Protection were developed.

Research and Development: An investigative study on understanding the causes of damages due to Cyclone Tauktae and Yaas was completed and a study on Baseline analysis and identification of entry points of disaster risk reduction in 5 cities under SMART City Mission is currently in progress.

COLLABORATIVE ADVOCACY

Advocacy through Inter Faith Humanitarian Alliance (IFHA): 12 Sessions on understanding COVID-19 Appropriate Behavior and Vaccinations were organized, two at National level and 10 State level sessions.

System Strengthening: Sphere India has initiated under various activities under systems strengthening support to five states and five smart cities to improve quality and accountability in resilience building.


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
