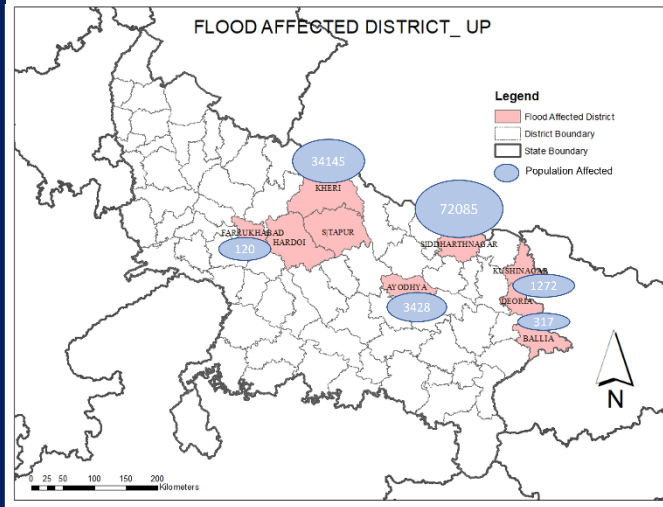


SITUATION REPORT- 2

Flood in Uttar Pradesh

SITUATION UPDATE AND RESPONSE

- A total of 9 districts and 21 tehsils are currently affected by the floods, bringing the overall counts to 26 districts and 76 tehsils impacted so far.
- The floods have impacted 258 villages, increasing the total number of affected villages to 1,809.
- The rural population affected by the floods stands at 111,367 people in the last 24 hours, contributing to a total of 1,527,976 affected rural residents. Additionally, a total of 73,174 urban population is also affected, bringing the overall affected population in both rural and urban areas to 1,601,150.
- Currently, 50 individuals are residing in flood shelters, bringing the total number of people housed in shelters to 2,666.
- A total of 125 livestock have been affected in the last 24 hours, increasing the total number of impacted livestock to 34,959.
- The floods have affected 11,523 hectares of land in last day, bringing the total affected area to 344,032 hectares. This includes 18,208 hectares of agricultural land and 14,528 hectares of sown area, with total affected areas now reaching 152,605 hectares and 87,353 hectares respectively. Additionally, 71 hectares are affected by erosion, increasing the total erosion-affected area to 5,134 hectares.
- The estimated crop damage value is ₹85,950 lakhs in the last 24 hours, contributing to a total damage value of ₹94,277 lakhs.
- No new human casualties have been reported, keeping the total number of deaths at 17.
- No new livestock deaths have been reported, maintaining the total number of livestock deaths at 29.
- One house has been reported damaged in the last day, bringing the total number of damaged houses to 2,138. So far, 35 families have received relief for house damage, with the total number of families receiving aid now at 1,714.
- A house got submerged in the Sharda river in Nayapurva village of Lakhimpur Kheri. Dozens of houses are under the threat of river erosion. This has created panic among the villagers.

Flood Situation in UP

- Earlier, 25 houses of Belhasiktiha had come under the danger of erosion. Here the Devi temple and the Barambaba tree have also been submerged in the river. Dambaltanda, Laukha, Dhakhiya villages of this area are also in great danger. Flood prevention work is going on here
- In the Phoolbehad area, the Sharda river is eroding the land and moving towards the villages of Dhobiana, Bechanpuwa and Pakriyapurwa. The river is cutting the main road

GOVERNMENT PREPAREDNESS & RESPONSE

- Regarding general relief operations, 17,167 food packets have been distributed, bringing the total number of food packets to 212,678. Additionally, 100 lunch packets have been distributed, increasing the overall total to 799,958 lunch packets.
- One community kitchen has been set up, making the total number of community kitchens 52.
- Relief efforts also include providing 100 liters of drinking water, bringing the overall total to 89,323 liters. Additionally, 5,206 ORS packets have been distributed, increasing the total to 382,651 packets.
- Furthermore, 11,499 chlorine tablets have been distributed, with the total number now at 947,573 tablets.
- 159,473 meters of tarpaulin have been provided, contributing to an overall total of 1,230,658 meters.
- In animal relief operations, 208 animal camps have been set up, increasing the total to 1,674 camps. A total of 1,345 animals have been treated, bringing the overall number of treated animals to 101,355. Additionally, 49,489 animals have been vaccinated, with the total number of vaccinations now at 947,369.
- A total of 81 quintals of fodder have been distributed, contributing to an overall total of 3,492.35 quintals.

HUMANITARIAN RESPONSE

- IAG Uttar Pradesh facilitated a meeting on July 11 to assess the situation and provide orientation on URS and JRNA processes.
- District and State IAG is monitoring the situation and coordinating with responding agencies and responding agencies
- Sphere India along with state IAG is monitoring the situation regularly
