D. HUMANITARIAN RESPONSE TO THE DISEASE

Government Response:

- Ministry of Home Affairs issued an order under the Disaster Management Act, 2005 to further extend the lockdown for a period of two weeks beyond 4 May, 2020 in order to combat the novel coronavirus outbreak in the country.
- MHA has also issued new guidelines to regulate different activities in this period based on risk profiling of the districts of the country into Red (hotspot), Green and Orange zone.
- In Orange Zones, inter-district movement of individuals and vehicles will be allowed for permitted activities only. Four-wheelers will have a maximum of 2 passengers besides the driver and pillion riding will be allowed on two-wheelers, stated MHA.
- Union Health Ministry had spelled out all major metropolitan cities—Delhi, Mumbai, Chennai, Kolkata, Hyderabad, Bengaluru and Ahmedabad—as red zones after the lockdown ends on May 3, and asked states and local bodies to demarcate containment areas and buffer zones for strict monitoring of movement.
- The MHA asked local authorities to ensure 100% coverage of the Aarogya Setu app among the residents in the containment zones. The National Directive for COVID-19 management said use of the Aarogya Setu application is to be mandatory for all employees, both private and public
- Government has decided to take only one-way fare from the migrant workers coming from outside and travelling by Karnataka State Road Transport Corporation in the state to reach their respective villages: Karnataka Chief Minister's Office
- Delhi Government is sending 40 buses to bring back its students from Kota, Rajasthan who are stuck there due to lockdown. Last-minute briefing of officials accompanying the buses going on at Kashmere Gate
- 5 trains have commenced their journeys carrying migrant workers, students & other people on the request of the respective state governments. The trains are - Lingampally to Hatia, Aluva to Bhubaneswar, Nashik to Bhopal, Jaipur to Patna, & Kota to Hatia: Railways official
- Special trains will run for migrant workers, pilgrims, tourists, students and other persons stranded at different places only on the request of state governments. Anyone who wants to travel should contact state governments only: Indian Railways

NGO / Civil Society Response

IAGs Kerala:

- IAG Trivandrum in collaboration with district administration has built a platform to rehabilitate the NRIs post pandemic. Furthermore 2 to 3 firms in the state have got certification from the govt. to prepare PPE kits. Currently, the capacity of each firm is limited to 20,000.
- Kerala Govt. has entered into the micro planning to fight COVID 19. Four hotspot districts have been identified. The administrations are doing the task of containment in each districts identified as hotspot. State IAGs still play the roles in providing food, supplying medicines, interstate transport of medicines and providing psychological support supplementing the government effort.



Other State IAGs:

- IAG Nagaland in collaboration with District Disable People Organization so called Mokokchung District Disable Forum (MDDF) distributed food grains to PWD.
- On behalf of the IAG(NL) NGOs Coordinators -Nagaland Development Outreach (NDO)& Bethesda Youth Welfare Centre (BYWC),all active and willing NGOs are requested to approach the respective DDMA's for better coordination's at the same time fervently request the respective DDMA's under the District Administration to kindly engage them responsibilities in their own domains if found dim fit.
- IAG Manipur in collaboration with IRMA effort reaching out to most vulnerable families with food items in Kangpokpi district. Provisions of distributing food sanitizers and masks worth of Rs. 20 lakhs in the interior villages especially the border areas of 7 districts. Caritas India has leveraged 1 lakh.
- IAG Mizoram in collaboration with Special Police Unit for North Eastern Region (SPUNER) has formed the North East Task Force which endeavors to facilitate and reach out to NE people in dire situation during lockdown.
- IAG MP along with UNICEF, WASH and DRR has organized an orientation program for district IAGs and CSOs on 27th April. IAG MP in collaboration with alumini's of PIMR donated 65 PPEs, 700 mask and 300 Gloves to Additional SP Office, Indore.
- SMILE Samajik Evam Sanskritik Vikas Sanstha along with Chhattisgarh IAG is involved in mask making and distribution, ration packet distribution, vegetable distribution, hand wash awareness campaign, and cattle feeding. Other district IAGs are in contact with urban slums through Mitani's. And distributing food to the relief centers. Many migrants. There are also some symptoms of irritability in those confined. Staffs are given awareness on COVID 19.
- IAG West Bengal have conducted 6 series of online training programs for our 1000 IAG volunteers. They are trained through initiative of WB state IAG. We have also planned our module keeping in mind the multilinguistic. IAG WB need list of registrants from WB state registering in COVID 19 Academy.
- IAG Gujarat is engaged in providing sanitisers, ration and awareness intervention. Accessibility of medicines for the vulnerable are being taken care of with the help of other agencies. Special intervention is being done for migrant workers especially in Surat and a feedback mechanism has also been established.
- IAG Karnataka and Indian Red Cross Society, Karnataka State Branch, Bangalore introduce a perfect opportunity to all those who are willing to do something useful during this lockdown due to the coronavirus outbreak. The Red Cross Red Crescent Learning platform i.e <https://ifrc.csod.com/client/ifrc/default.aspx> is an online learning program developed for the Red Cross volunteers, staffs, and partners including the general public.
- IAG Jharkhand with support of UNICEF and other agencies has planned a gap analysis of the entire state. Post that state IAG will be involved in filling out those gaps. Further, 53 lakh cash have been leveraged for help apart from govt relief package in the state to help people. Nodal agencies in few districts have been identified and work of coordination is in progress. 3000 volunteers have been identified with the help of IAG for capacity building.
- IAG Maharashtra has developed materials in local language for frontline workers. We are figuring out the learning need of all volunteers and workers and on basis of that we will build training prog.
- Agencies and IAG Bihar networks are responding in small way. We have less scope to coordinate with the administration. We had a zoom meeting to make a petition to present it to administration to allow CSOs a larger role. We are not getting to formally respond to COVID 19. Food and dry ration are distributed, malnutrition is on high and we in our capacity are trying to respond to such needs.
- IAG UP have identified district nodal person and are segregating volunteers in different districts for work. State IAG together with UPSDMA are working on mass training of the volunteers and skill upgradation of already trained ones. Regular assessment of such training is also being done.



- IAG Rajasthan has drafted a Joint appeal letter to protect the vulnerable group letter to be send to CM office in order to bring out last mile gaps.
- IAG Himachal Pradesh is coordinating with Aangawadi workers, Aasha workers and with government in their effort to provide ration to daily wage workers.
- In Karnataka Indian Red CROSS have tied up with DIPR (Department of Information and Public Relation) in volunteer mobilisation and participation. Special helpline is opened up by the department for migrant labourers. 16,000 application is received under Cornawarrior campaign. District administration has activated BBMP wardroom in the state.
- IAG Tripura with 4 other organisations are planning to take up food distribution for the labourers. Request for obtaining the permission for the same has already been sent to the govt.
- IAG Odisha is working in collaboration with 11 IAS officers and health department in countering the cases and spreading awareness. Govt of Odisha is providing cooked food to 80 urban and local bodies covering 90,000 of the population. Shelter camps have already been arranged by the govt for migrant laborers.
- IAG Tamil Nadu and govt are identifying epicenter of outbreak and screening of the identified hotbeds have already started. IAG is also meeting with advising agencies to not violate the rules of lockdown and work within the permission granted. Message of staff security is also being spread.
- The Dehra dun district administration announces "Agnes Kunze Society- HOPE Project " the Corona Warriors of the day (26 April 2020) in the civil society category. Distribution of dry ration kits, sanatizers, handwash & masks to needy people and educating them about Corona virus by HIRA team in collaboration with IAG Uttrakhand.

CSR response:

- HCL has formed a special task force to monitor the situation proactively and respond to requests coming in from the State machineries as well as our NGO partners.
- HCL is taking tangible steps and has devised a holistic strategy which includes support towards:

Training, capacity building, awareness and coordination

- Supporting the Gautam Buddha Nagar district administration with an Integrated Control Center to respond to citizens' queries on COVID-19. The "all-in-one" control center will include processes for following up and reporting of all unconfirmed, suspected, foreign return cases as well as mobile tracking and monitoring for all home quarantine cases basis inputs from official government authorities. - HCL is extending its support to the Relief Commission, Government of Tamil Nadu to setup a state-of-the-art call center for COVID-19 related support, as well as a command and control center for coordination and data analytics
- HCL is setting up an Emergency Call Centre for COVID-19 for State of Karnataka providing telemedicine and referrals for testing
- HCL Foundation, along with WHO and UNICEF, is supporting a COVID-19 Online Academy by Sphere India. This is being used for training of volunteers, health workers and other front line workers on COVID-19
- Awareness Generation and Information Dissemination of COVID-19 messages approved by Directorate of Health GoUP in Hardoi, Uttar Pradesh. Over 6000 villagers and front-line workers are being sensitized through these messages

Complementing healthcare services

- Pledged 500 Ventilators to the Government of Tamil Nadu and two ventilators in the Vijayawada district of Andhra Pradesh



- Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) for healthcare and frontline workers
- One Lakh PPE kits to the State of Uttar Pradesh and 1,600 to Madurai Corporation in Tamil Nadu
- 15,000 face masks to Noida Authority for sanitation workers in Gautam Buddha Nagar
- Self Help Groups (SHG) women are being trained to stitch masks - 2,100 masks prepared and distributed in Nagpur and 100 khadi masks being distributed daily through UPSRLM in Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh
- 100 Kits (with masks & gloves) for Police staff and NGO volunteers in Chennai, Tamil Nadu

Maintaining food security and supplies

- Supporting with both cooked meals and well as dry ration kits in Gautam Buddha Nagar, Chennai, Nagpur and Pune
- 12,000 hot cooked meal packets daily for the marginalized communities through Gautam Buddha Nagar district administration. Over 1.40 lakh meals have already been served as part of this initiative.
- Dry ration kits for 1500 families in Kannagi Nagar Slum in Chennai and 700 families Nagpur

Care for vulnerable groups, including the elderly, women and children

- Medicines, emergency services, caregiver salaries to care for 200 elderly people in SHEOWS Garhmukhteshwar Ashram

Animal welfare:

- Feeding over 3000 animals every day through our NGO partner in Noida and 100 stray animals in Bangalore

Tata trust

- Tata trust ordered 9,00,000 PPE equipment's and distributed to hospitals to different locations in response to COVID 19. They further procured 2,80,000 testing kits.
- In their effort also extended to 1100 plus beds for isolation, quarantine and observation facilities in centre. 1.4 million litres of disinfectants has been distributed. 35,000 plus litres of hand sanitisers dispatched.
- 2 million meals and 5,00,000 kg of food supplies distributed to medical staff, migrant workers, daily wage earners and the underprivileged in 24 states across states.

Sphere India and other NGOs:

- SOS Children's Villages of India has so far provided Ration, Hygiene & Sanitizer Kits to 5197 families and only Hygiene & Sanitizer Kits to 2697 families in 143 villages/communities in 21 States and 3 Union Territories in their on-going Family Strengthening Programmes. SOS India is also ensuring the care and protection of 6685 parent-less children under their Family-Like Care Programme in 32 Children's Villages. Awareness programmes through Self-Help Groups and Bal-Panchayats had been conducted prior to the lockdown and through WhatsApp and IEC/BCC materials.
- Habitat for Humanity is providing Hygiene and Family Essentials Kits to 514 daily wage laborers and their family living in Wazirpur Industrial Area, New Delhi. Waste pickers and daily wage earners living in Park Circus slum in Kolkata received Hygiene and Family Essentials Kits. This program has reached out to many thousands of migrant labourers across India.
- Oasis India is involved in distribution of food rations to un-reached location in Mumbai and Chittoor Andhra Pradesh and online fundraising for emergency response through social media.
- CECOWOR-Centre for Coordination of voluntary works and Research is helping with awareness on precaution, food item distribution and networking with government department.
- PPEs are being manufactured by a few companies in Kerala whose samples were tested by SITRA and



INMAS. These are available in two qualities: one for doctors who are in the ICUs directly handling Covid19 patients and the second quality for nurses, paramedics and hospital staff.

- Sphere India is planning a session on migrant workers, impact and implication during pandemic and post analysis in partnership with International Organisation of Migrants. Furthermore, a working committee has also been set up by Sphere India specifically focusing and working towards urban planning and slums.
- Sphere India in its attempt to extend COVID 19 Academy training in vernacular language is having its second session in Hindi on “FAQs of COVID 19”.
- Furthermore, NDMA has requested Sphere India to collate information of all organisations who are willing to support with their interventions in the current crisis.
