## D. HUMANITARIAN RESPONSE TO THE DISEASE

### Government Response:

- Ministry of Home Affairs issued an order under the Disaster Management Act, 2005 to further extend the lockdown for a period of two weeks beyond 4 May 2020 in order to combat the novel coronavirus outbreak in the country.
- MHA has also issued new guidelines to regulate different activities in this period based on risk profiling of the districts of the country into Red (hotspot), Green and Orange zone.
- India begins to partially open up its economy in areas that are not much affected by the novel coronavirus
- The Indian government has decided to repatriate its citizens in two special flights from the United Arab Emirates (UAE) to India on May 7 as part of the country's largest overseas evacuation of stranded Indian nationals abroad since independence.
- To contain the spread of coronavirus, spitting saliva, gutka or tobacco in public places in Noida has been prohibited and violation of this can attract a penalty of Rs 500 for first time offenders and Rs 1,000 for repeat offenders.
- The MHA asked local authorities to ensure 100% coverage of the Aarogya Setu app among the residents in the containment zones. The National Directive for COVID-19 management said use of the Aarogya Setu application is to be mandatory for all employees, both private and public
- Not having the Aarogya Setu application on your smartphone in Noida and Greater Noida has been made a punishable offence by the Noida police. All those with smartphones who do not have the application can be booked under Section 188 of the IPC.
- Delhi Government is sending 40 buses to bring back its students from Kota, Rajasthan who are stuck there due to lockdown
- Health Minister Harsh Vardhan said that India has been able to keep itself from slipping into community transmission of COVID-19
- Special trains will run for migrant workers, pilgrims, tourists, students and other persons stranded at different places only on the request of state governments. Anyone who wants to travel should contact state governments only: Indian Railways

### NGO / Civil Society Response

#### IAGs Kerala:

- Kerala Govt. has entered into the micro planning to fight COVID 19. For two days there has been no new case of coronavirus. Four hotspot districts have been identified. The administrations are doing the task of containment in each district identified as hotspot. State IAGs still play the roles in providing food, supplying medicines, interstate transport of medicines and providing psychological support supplementing the government effort
- IAG Kerala held an Emergency level coordination meeting with district collector and awareness generation through various campaigns and multilingual materials

#### Other State IAGs:

- IAG Nagaland in collaboration with District Disable People Organization so called Mokochung District Disable Forum (MDDF) distributed food grains to PWD.



- On behalf of the IAG(NL) NGOs Coordinators -Nagaland Development Outreach (NDO) & Bethesda Youth Welfare Centre (BYWC),all active and willing NGOs are requested to approach the respective DDMA's for better coordination's at the same time fervently request the respective DDMA's under the District Administration to kindly engage them responsibilities in their own domains if found dim fit.
- IAG Manipur - IRMA is reaching out to most vulnerable families with food items in Kangpokpi district. DSSS, Imphal have a provisions of distributing food items, sanitizers and masks worth of Rs. 20 lakhs in the interior villages especially the border areas of 7 districts in Manipur. Caritas India has leveraged 1 lakh to DSSS Imphal. IAG Mizoram in collaboration with Special Police Unit for North Eastern Region (SPUNER) has formed the North East Task Force which endeavors to facilitate and reach out to NE people in dire situation during lockdown.
- IAG Bihar is working closely with BSDMA in bringing back the stranded students and migrant workers. A lot of coordination work is going on.
- IAG MP in coordination with the state government has rolled out IITT strategy- I-Identification of suspected cases, Hotspots and clusters, I-Isolation and Quarantine of suspected cases and containment zone, T- Tracing of contacts and testing of high-risk cases and T- Treatment of suspected and confirmed cases.
- Orientation on infection prevention and control – COVID-19 for IAG MP members and staff has been planned by IAG members of MP.
- IAG Assam has been involved in lot of community awareness program in local language and Assam has diverse community. Local language translation has been done to reach out to the last mile.
- SMILE Samajik Evam Sanskritik Vikas Sanstha along with Chhattisgarh IAG is involved in mask making and distribution, ration packet distribution, vegetable distribution, hand wash awareness campaign, and cattle feeding. Other district IAGs are in contact with urban slums through Mitansins.
- IAGs of West Bengal state are assisting Gram Panchayats, Block Administration in terms of Relief Distribution and are helping in awareness generation on hand wash and facilitating the process of maintaining social distancing.
- 98% of the IAG West Bengal members shared the information of “Sneher Parash”, a new scheme introduced for the migrant workers, who are resident of West Bengal and who are stranded in different parts of the country.
- IAG Gujarat is engaged in providing sanitisers, ration and awareness intervention. Accessibility of medicines for the vulnerable are being taken care of with the help of other agencies. Special intervention is being done for migrant workers especially in Surat and a feedback mechanism has also been established.
- IAG Karnataka and Indian Red Cross Society, Karnataka State Branch, Bangalore introduce a perfect opportunity to all those who are willing to do something useful during this lockdown due to the coronavirus outbreak. The Red Cross Red Crescent Learning platform i.e <https://ifrc.csod.com/client/ifrc/default.aspx> is an online learning program developed for the Red Cross volunteers, staffs, and partners including the general public.
- IAG Jharkhand with support of UNICEF India and other agencies has planned a gap analysis of the entire state. Post that state IAG will be involved in filling out those gaps. Further, 53 lakh cash have been leveraged for help apart from govt relief package in the state to help people. Nodal agencies in few districts have been identified and work of coordination is in progress. 3000 volunteers have been identified with the help of IAG for capacity building.
- IAG Maharashtra has developed materials in local language for frontline workers and are currently working in ration and food distribution.
- IAG UP have identified district nodal person and are segregating volunteers in different districts for work. State IAG together with UPSDMA are working on mass training of the volunteers and skill upgradation of already trained ones. Regular assessment of such training is also being done.



- IAG Rajasthan had submitted a Joint appeal letter to protect the vulnerable group to CM office in order to bring out last mile gaps. IAG Himachal Pradesh is coordinating with Aangawadi workers, Aasha workers and with government in their effort to provide ration to daily wage workers.
- IAG Tripura with 4 other organisations are planning to take up food distribution for the labourers. Request for obtaining the permission for the same has already been sent to the govt.
- IAG Odisha in helping and coordinating with state govt in rapid testing. We have activated Go-NGO coordination in all 30 districts and meetings are happening following norms of social distancing.
- Govt has launched a dedicated website where IAG Odisha played crucial role. Presently 600 CSOs have registered and 10330 volunteers have also registered.
- IAG Tamil Nadu in collaboration with districts administration are identifying epicenter of outbreak and screening of the identified hotbeds have already started. IAG is also meeting with advising agencies to not violate the rules of lockdown and work within the permission granted. Message of staff security is also being spread. The Dehra dun district administration announces "Agnes Kunze Society- HOPE Project" the Corona Warriors of the day (26 April 2020) in the civil society category. Distribution of dry ration kits, sanitizers, handwash & masks to needy people and educating them about Corona virus by HIRA team in collaboration with IAG Uttarakhand.

#### CSR response:

- HCL has formed a special task force to monitor the situation proactively and respond to requests coming in from the State machineries as well as their NGO partners.
- HCL is taking tangible steps and has devised a holistic strategy which includes support towards the State Governments in their efforts to contain the spread of the disease as well as helping the marginalized communities:

#### Training, capacity building, awareness and coordination

- Supporting the Gautam Buddha Nagar district administration with an Integrated Control Center to respond to citizens' queries on COVID-19. The "all-in-one" control center will include processes for following up and reporting of all unconfirmed, suspected, foreign return cases as well as mobile tracking and monitoring for all home quarantine cases basis inputs from official government authorities. - HCL is extending its support to the Relief Commission, Government of Tamil Nadu to setup a state-of-the-art call center for COVID-19 related support, as well as a command and control center for coordination and data analytics
- HCL is setting up an Emergency Call Centre for COVID-19 for State of Karnataka providing telemedicine and referrals for testing
- HCL Foundation, along with WHO and UNICEF, is supporting a COVID-19 Online Academy by Sphere India. This is being used for training of volunteers, health workers and other front-line workers on COVID-19
- Awareness Generation and Information Dissemination of COVID-19 messages approved by Directorate of Health GoUP in Hardoi, Uttar Pradesh. Over 6000 villagers and front-line workers are being sensitized through these messages

#### Complementing healthcare services

- Pledged 607 Ventilators to the Government of Tamil Nadu and two ventilators in the Vijayawada district of Andhra Pradesh
- 550 litres Sanitizer and Wash Basin (Leg Pedal) to City Health Officer, Coimbatore Corporation

Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) for healthcare and frontline workers



- 1,00,000 PPE kits to the State of Uttar Pradesh,
- 1,600 PPE kits to Madurai Corporation in Tamil Nadu, 100 PPE kits for doctors and paramedical staff at Stanley Government Hospital, Chennai, and 14,500 PPE Kits to City Health Officer, Coimbatore Corporation
- 20,000 3-ply masks to City Health Officer, Coimbatore Corporation, 100 Kits (with masks & gloves) for Police staff and NGO volunteers in Chennai and 15,000 face masks to Noida Authority for sanitation workers in Gautam Buddh Nadar
- Self Help Groups (SHG) women are being trained to stitch masks - 2,100 masks prepared and distributed in Nagpur and 100 khadi masks being distributed daily through UPSRLM in Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh

#### Ensuring food security and supplies

- Supporting with both cooked meals and well as dry ration kits in Gautam Buddh Nagar, Chennai, Nagpur, Pune and Vijayawada
- 10,000 - 20,000 hot cooked meal packets daily (as per notified requirement from Govt. Dept.) for the marginalized communities through Gautam Buddh Nagar District Administration. Over 4.2 lakh meals have already been served as part of this initiative.
- 3,500 - 5,000 hot cooked meal packets (basis requirement) for the marginalized communities in Chennai through Greater Chennai City Corporation. Over 54 thousand meals have already been served as part of this initiative.
- Dry ration kits provided to 4,100+ families in slum communities of Chennai, Lucknow, Vijayawada, Nagpur & Pune (1,500 in Chennai, 1,514 in Vijayawada, 700 in Nagpur, 350 in Lucknow, 84 in Pune)

#### Care for vulnerable groups, including the elderly, women and children

- Medicines, emergency services, caregiver salaries to care for 200 elderly people in SHEOWS Garhmukhteshwar Ashram

#### Animal Welfare:

- Feeding over 3000 animals every day through our NGO partner in Noida and 100 stray animals in Bangalore

#### Reliance Foundation

All beds are equipped with the required infrastructure, bio medical equipment such as ventilators, pacemakers, dialysis machine and patient monitoring devices.
  - Sir H. N. Reliance Foundation Hospital, a world-class healthcare institution in Mumbai, has also offered to set up special medical facilities to quarantine travellers from notified countries and suspected cases identified through contact tracing. This will quickly augment additional facilities for isolation and treatment of infected patients.
  - Free Meals in Various Cities: Reliance Foundation will provide free meals to people across various cities in partnership with NGOs to offer necessary livelihood relief in the current crisis situation.
  - Isolation Facility at Lodhivali: RIL has built a fully-equipped isolation facility in Lodhivali, Maharashtra and handed it over to the District authorities.
- Reliance Life Sciences is importing additional test kits and consumables for effective testing. Our doctors and researchers are also working overtime to find a cure for this deadly virus.
- Masks and Personnel Protective Suits for Health-workers: RIL is enhancing its production capacities to produce 100,000 face-masks per day and a large number of personal protective equipments (PPEs), such as suits and garments, for the nation's healthworkers to equip them further to fight the coronavirus challenge.
- RIL has today announced an initial support of Rs. 5 crore to Maharashtra Chief Minister's Relief Fund
- All 736 grocery stores of Reliance Retail across the country will ensure sufficient supply of essentials, including staples, fruits and vegetables, bread, breakfast cereals and other items of daily use, so that citizens need not stock up.

#### **Tata trusts**

- Tata trust ordered 9,00,000 PPE equipment's and distributed to hospitals to different locations in response to COVID 19. They further procured 2,80,000 testing kits.
- In their effort also extended to 1100 plus beds for isolation, quarantine and observation facilities in centre. 1.4 million litres of disinfectants has been distributed. 35,000 plus litres of hand sanitisers dispatched.



- 2 million meals and 5,00,000 kg of food supplies distributed to medical staff, migrant workers, daily wage earners and the underprivileged in 24 states across states.
- Tata Trusts is airlifting critical supplies for country-wide deployment to support India's Covid-19 interventions. The operation is being done with the support of Tata International Limited: The items being imported comprise Personal Protection Equipment kits (including coveralls, masks, gloves and goggles) N95/KN95 masks and Surgical masks of different grades. The consignment, of about one crore individual units, will arrive in multiple batches and will be deployed where these are most needed across the country through the coming weeks. The total value committed so far to the sourcing of such materials is about Rs 150 crores.
- Tata Trusts has begun a pan-India community outreach to induce adoption of health practices, as promoted by the Government of India, in rural areas to prevent the spread of COVID-19. Beginning 31st March, the exercise is expected to have already reached about 12 million people in 21 states.
  - The campaign '5 Kadam, Corona Mukta Jeevan', ranges from video messages in the country's languages, even dialects, short animation videos and infographics to audio messages, and SMS based messaging.
  - Over 70 celebrities, from all over India, have lent their support with video and audio messages. Among them are Nana Patekar, Sonali Kulkarni, Harbhajan Singh, Ila Arun, Atul Kulkarni, Malini Awasthi, and Sanju Samson for Rajasthan Royals, to name a few.
  - The Trusts have deployed more than 430 master trainers in 21 states who in turn have trained a pool of over 8,700 community resource persons (village volunteers) to deliver the message till the last mile. Through the existing network of the Trusts' programmes, the volunteers, associate organisations of the Trusts, community radios, village-based public address systems, and use of various internet and communication technologies, the programme is expected to have reached out to about 12 million people till date.

### **Sphere India and its members**

- SOS Children's Villages of India has so far provided Ration, Hygiene & Sanitizer Kits to 5197 families and only Hygiene & Sanitizer Kits to 2697 families in 143 villages/communities in 21 States and 3 Union Territories in their on-going Family Strengthening Program. SOS India is also ensuring the care and protection of 6685 parent-less children under their Family-Like Care Program in 32 Children's Villages. Awareness program through Self-Help Groups and Bal-Panchayats had been conducted prior to the lockdown and through WhatsApp and IEC/BCC materials.
- Habitat for Humanity is providing Hygiene and Family Essentials Kits to 514 daily wage laborers and their family living in Wazirpur Industrial Area, New Delhi. Waste pickers and daily wage earners living in Park Circus slum in Kolkata received Hygiene and Family Essentials Kits. This program has reached out to many thousands of migrant laborer's across India.
- Oasis India is involved in distribution of food rations to un-reached location in Mumbai and Chittoor Andhra Pradesh and online fundraising for emergency response through social media.
- CECOWOR-Centre for Coordination of voluntary works and Research is helping with awareness on precaution, food item distribution and networking with government department.
- Sphere India successfully completed its session on migrant workers, impact and implication during pandemic and post analysis in partnership with International Organization of Migrants. Furthermore, a working committee has also been set up by Sphere India specifically focusing and working towards urban planning and slums.
- Sphere India in its attempt to address the need preparing for worst scenario and need to be clear, strategic and focused on our role to reducing human suffering and preventing life loss by strengthening the Emergency Response Preparedness ( ERP) through Network Approaches to



supplement the government efforts in amid of the COVID 19 outbreak organized a multi hazard meeting with its IAG conveners, sector committees and its members organisation.

- Sphere India in its effort of extending capacity building initiative is having its second panel discussion on WASH interlinkages on 5<sup>th</sup> May 2020
- Furthermore, NDMA has requested Sphere India to collate information of all organisations who are willing to support with their interventions in the current crisis.
