D. HUMANITARIAN RESPONSE TO THE DISEASE

Government Response:

- Govt. to take decision on resuming train, airline services, any discussion futile: Javadekar
- The Union Ministry of Home Affairs today reversed its earlier position of allowing e-commerce companies to supply non-essential goods as well.
- Hon'ble Prime Minister of India, Shri Narendra Modi appeal to all employees of his ministries to contribute a day's salary to PM CARES-a dedicated national fund to deal with any kind of emergency like Covid-19
- The latest circular issued by the Department of Revenue, which comes under the finance ministry, Friday, appealing to all officers and staff to "contribute their one day's salary every month till March 2021 to the PM CARES
- The Maharashtra government has issued a detailed list of select activities that will be allowed starting April 20.
- In a major spike in COVID-19 cases, the Indian Council of Medical Research reported that a total of 16,365 individuals have now been confirmed positive in the country
- The Delhi government has decided to not relax the ongoing lockdown as of now as the coronavirus appears to be spreading in the national capital.

NGO / Civil Society Response

IAGs Kerala:

- IAG Thrissur collaborated with human society international for animal care during COVID 19 outbreak.
- IAG Thrissur has also created focused programs on Disability, Palliative and Geriatric Care for awareness.
- IAG Kasargod is working on awareness generation among people through classes and demonstration, by methods of hand washing and providing adequate water, soap and hand liquid. They have also created a sector wise taskforce with professionals for the response.
- Kerala Govt. has entered into the microplanning. We have 4 hotspot districts. And the hotspots in each district have also been identified and administrations are doing the task of containment. State IAGs still plays the roles in providing food, supplying medicines, interstate transport of medicines, providing psychological support

Other State IAGs:

- IAG Nagaland in collaboration with Baptist Church and Jotsoma and tailored by BKK has produced 4000 multi coloured. These shall be on the streets within a day or two to fight against COVID 19.
- IAG Manipur is helping local community organization in producing homemade masks as there is a crisis of masks in the market. As of now, a total of 1300 masks have been produced. Also, world vision is spreading awareness in the community groups.
- IAG MP is involved in risk communication and community. they started a COVID 19 rapid relief fund network to reach vulnerable and marginalised communities.
- The Chhattisgarh government is making ration cards for households excluded from the PDS and adding the names of excluded family members on their ration card during the lockdown. Under the Mukhyamantri Suposhan Abhiyan, beneficiaries will receive at home 100 gm of rice, 25 gm pulse and eggs. per day till May 3 Dainikbaskar. IAGs are in contact with urban slums through Mitans. And distributing food to the relief centers. Many migrants. There are also some symptoms of irritability in those confined. Staffs are given awareness on COVID 19.
- IAG West Bengal have conducted 6 series of online training programs for our 1000 IAG volunteers.



They are trained through initiative of WB state IAG. We have also planned our module keeping in mind the multilinguistic. IAG WB need list of registrants from WB state registering in COVID 19 Academy.

- More than 100 participants from the state are being trained in the academy. IAG Jharkhand network and volunteers are involved in wall writing in the local language so that primitive and tribal understand the message. Ration and hygiene kits along with guidelines are provided in remote and tribal areas. Gap analysis process is started by Jharkhand govt and IAG is closely assisting administration in this planning along with other international organisations. We are in process of finalising nodal agency at district level through that we will coordinate better with the district administration.
- IAG Maharashtra has developed materials in local language for frontline workers. We are figuring out the learning need of all volunteers and workers and on basis of that we will build training prog.
- 4 districts have been declared as a hotspots. Agencies and IAG Bihar networks are responding in small way. We have less scope to coordinate with the administration. We had a zoom meeting to make a petition to present it to administration to allow CSOs a larger role. We are not getting to formally respond to COVID 19. Food and dry ration are distributed, malnutrition is on high and we in our capacity are trying to respond to such needs. Horlicks brand have also given a helping hand to all in providing food packets.
- IAG UP in collaboration with UPSDMA and CASA is jointly supporting regular feedback mechanism and agenda setting system. CASA is actively involved in mass training of the volunteers.
- IAG Rajasthan has drafted a Joint appeal letter to protect the vulnerable group letter to be send to CM office in order to bring out last mile gaps.
- Various organisation in Bihar is working in collaboration with IAG in providing food packets. Indra Gandhi organisation, UNICEF are all providing food packets through network created by BSDMA.
- IAG Himachal Pradesh is coordinating with Aangawadi workers, Aasha workers and with government in their effort to provide ration to daily wage workers.
- With the support of terredes home NL, IAG Jharkhand has reached to the unreachable migrant labourers in 2 boarder District of Jharkhand, Koderma and Giridih.
- In Karnataka Indian Red CROSS have tied up with DIPR (Department of Information and Public Relation) in volunteer mobilisation and participation. Special helpline is opened up by the department for migrant labourers. 16,000 application is received under Cornawarrior campaign. District administration has activated BBMP wardroom in the state.
- IAG Tripura with 4 other organisations are planning to taken up food distribution for the labourers. Request for obtaining the permission for the same has already been sent to the govt.
- IAG Odisha is working in collaboration with 11 IAS officers and health department in countering the cases and spreading awareness. Govt of Odisha is providing cooked food to 80 urban and local bodies covering 90,000 of the population. Shelter camps have already been arranged by the govt for migrant laborers.
- IAG Tamil Nadu and govt are identifying epicenter of outbreak and screening of the identified hotbeds have already started. IAG is also meeting with advising agencies to not violate the rules of lockdown and work within the permission granted. Message of staff security is also being spread.
- IAG Uttrakhand is directly working with state satellite control room for contact tracing. Further, CASA with the help of IAG is providing dry ration to 100 families.
- 5 local organisations are involved in making homemade masks and distributing to vulnerable groups.

Sphere India and its members

- CASA, EFICOR, HFA and OXFAM have come forward to join hands with Delhi Govt. They have provided Ration Kits to Delhi Govt which is now reaching to Unreached.



- World Vision India has stated responding to COVID-19 in almost 21 states in India. They have provided over **110,384** meals for vulnerable people through local administration. Dry rations distributed to over 8021 families. Around 9141 masks distributed and over 1500 medical professionals provided PPE kit. More than 1200 community volunteers trained
- RedR is conducting a national learning needs assessment for ngo staff which will enable to develop actor and sector specific learning material and conduct training on them. We seek Sphere India and IAG members support in circulating it. We are also exploring partnerships to take this initiative forward.
- Network for Youth Development and Healthy Environment -NYDHEE is organising Gram Pradhans to use VHSNC's untied fund for sanitization, IEC materials dissemination through Social media.
- Sphere India is drafting advocacy note for all sectors led by respective sector committees which addresses the issues of protection of migrant workers across India sector wise and holistically. Issues have also been raised during nodal coordination with Govt.
- Sphere India organized its 5th State IAG Convener meeting on 18th April over zoom. Sphere India and its members and IAGs decided upon being in close touch coordination with WHO and government officials as government will be frequently changing their plans and decisions from now on.
- Sphere India next session of COVID 19 Academy on WELFARE OF ANIMALS IN NEED DURING COVID-19 CRISIS is scheduled for April 20, 2020, 4pm to 5.20pm. Resource Person of the session are Mr. Hansen Thambi Prem, WAP and Mr. Sumanth Bindumadhav, HIS.
- Furthermore, NDMA has requested Sphere India to collate information of all organisations who are willing to support with their interventions in the current crisis.
