SITUATION UPDATE AND RESPONSE

Situation in south India

- Due to cyclone Mandous, Heavy rains continue in coastal areas of Tamil Nadu, and floods in low-lying areas of Chennai.
- So far 8000 people have been relocated in Chennai alone
- Power supply from about 12 sub-stations was disrupted. Electricity connection has not been restored in many places.
- About 400 trees were uprooted in Chennai alone
- The Central Water Commission has reported a severe flood warning for Kalingi river in Sullurpet and Pallamala basin on 10th December
- 13 houses were destroyed in Puducherry due to sea surge
- Home Minister MK Stalin confirmed that more than 180 houses were destroyed in Tamil Nadu
- 201 relief centers were opened in Tamil Nadu and 28 in Andhra Pradesh
- Widespread damage was also reported in southern Andhra Pradesh. 120 hectares of farmland was destroyed by water.
- According to a status report of the Andhra Pradesh government, Naidupeta in Tirupati district received the highest rainfall at 281.5 mm during the past 24 hours ending at 8.30 am on Saturday

Humanitarian Response

Government Preparedness and Response

Preparedness:

IMD has issued Light to moderate rainfall at many places with heavy rainfall at isolated places likely over north Tamil Nadu and south interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe on 11th December and Light to moderate rainfall at many places with heavy rainfall at isolated places likely over north Tamil Nadu and south interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe on 12th and 13th December.

CWC has reported severe flood warning for Kalingi river in Sullurpet and Pallamala basin.

Response:

- Chief minister M K Stalin inspected the cyclone-affected areas & distributed relief materials to people affected by the cyclone. He also assured compensation to affected people and fishermen after damage assessment is completed.
- Tamil Nadu government opens the shelter and provides breakfast to the people
- Seven NDRF and another five SDRF teams have been deployed in Andhra Pradesh.
- Six teams of National Disaster Response Force has been deployed in Tamil nadu
