SITUATION UPDATE AND RESPONSE

Situation in Madhya Pradesh

- Cities like Jabalpur and Bundelkhand witnessed severe waterlogging
- Rivers Chapi and Betwa are flowing in extreme flood situation in district of Rajgarh and Vidisha.
- As of Monday morning, Madhya Pradesh has received 879 mm of rainfall during the season (since June 1), which is 26 percent more. 14 districts of the state have received 30-85 percent excess rainfall so far.
- The gates of Tawa Dam in Narmadapuram and three dams in Bhopal were opened to release excess rain water.
- Hanuman Tal in Jabalpur and Chhatarpur in Bundelkhand were flooded due to heavy rains.
- Many bridges are under water and roads are closed
- Half a dozen villages in Vidisha's Lateri were destroyed after a stop dam collapsed and water entered the fields.
- Power supply was disrupted for several hours since Monday morning and was not restored till evening in most parts of the Bhopal city. More than two hundred trees were uprooted; Some of them fell on power lines.
- Upper Lake in Bhopal, which is full to capacity, saw high waves that caused the cruise 'Lake Princess' of the MP Tourism Department to sink partially.
- Guna-Parvati River's strong current has damaged the railway track, the track of the bridge built near Kumbhraj railway station has collapsed, the trains on the route have now stopped, the Ujjain, Indore, Ratlam, Gwalior and Bina Kota route has been affected.
- The interior of a house collapsed in Jabalpur due to incessant rain, rescue teams rescued two families trapped on the second floor, saving 8 lives.
- schools have been closed in some districts including Bhopal and Jabalpur

Government Preparedness and Response

Preparedness:

IMD has issued a warning of Widespread light/moderate rainfall with isolated heavy to very heavy rainfall with extremely heavy falls very likely over West Madhya Pradesh on 22nd August, 2022 and Fairly widespread/widespread light/moderate rainfall with isolated heavy falls and thunderstorm/lightning very likely over East Madhya Pradesh on 22nd & 26th and West Madhya Pradesh on 23rd. There are no red alerts issued by IMD for any districts in Madhya Pradesh from 23rd to 27th August.

The Central Water Commission has issued an Extreme flood alert for Chappi and Bet rivers

Response:

- In the last 24 hours, State Disaster Emergency Response Force (SDERF) and National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) together have rescued over 400 people from floods/excess rain in the state.
- Chief Minister Shivraj S Chouhan will conduct an aerial survey of the flood-affected areas of the Vidhisha district
- Madhya Pradesh CM Shivraj S Chouhan reviewed the situation in rain affected districts.
- IAF to deploy two Medium Lift Helicopters Mi-17 V5 at Vidisha, MP, based on request from #MadhyaPradesh Govt for Humanitarian Assistance & Disaster Relief operations
