SITUATION UPDATE AND RESPONSE

Situation in Uttar Pradesh

- 355 villages of 12 districts and 615314 people in Uttar Pradesh are affected due to flood during the last 24 hrs.
- 10958 people displaced due to Flood
- Rapti river at Shrawasti district and Balrampur district are flowing in an extreme flood situation
- In the last 2-3 days, more than 13 people have died due to drowning due to floods, apart from this, many deaths have also occurred due to snakebites.
- Burhi Rapti river in Siddharth Nagar district, Sarju(Babal) river in Bahraich district, Ghagra river in Barabanki, Ayodhya, and Ballia districts, Rohin river at Maharajganj district, Ghanga river at Budaun district, Rapti river at Gorakhpur district, Kwano river at Gonda district and Sarda river at Kheri district are flowing in severe flood situation
- A lekhpal who was going to distribute relief material in the flood died due to sinking
- Toilets and clean drinking water are the biggest problem for the flood victims as there is no alternative at the local level
- Many homes are flooded and people are unable to cook, and they are unable to deliver groceries or food.
- Some displaced families are tied up under the open sky or living in high places which are in need of tarpaulin urgently
- Heavy rainfall in Lucknow led to the waterlogging in streets and damage to trees. In one incident, a wall collapsed in Lucknow due to rain, leading to deaths of nine people
- With over 24 hours of incessant rains, life has been disrupted to a large extent. Streets were flooded in Aligarh and water entered houses and shops of people. Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College, Aligarh Muslim University also reported water entering the premises.
- Balrampur District Magistrate Mahendra Kumar has appealed to villagers living in low-lying areas to vacate their houses and move to shelters.
- The traffic movement on Balrampur-Badhri National Highway 730 was affected on Sunday after it was inundated by floodwater.

Humanitarian Response

Government Preparedness and Response

Preparedness:

IMD has issued a warning of Fairly widespread/widespread light/moderate rainfall with isolated/scattered heavy falls & thunderstorm/lightning very likely over, Uttar Pradesh on 09th & 10th October, 2022 and Isolated very heavy rainfall very likely over West Uttar Pradesh on 09th October, 2022.

CWC issued Extreme flood alert for Rapti river in Bhinga, Shrawasti district and in Balrampur, Balrampur district in 09th October 2022

CWC also issued severe flood alert for Burhi Rapti river in Siddharth Nagar district, Sarju(Babal) river in Bahraich district, Ghagra river in Barabanki, Ayodhya, and Ballia districts, Rohin river at Maharajganj district, Ghanga river at Budaun district, Rapti river at Gorakhpur district, Kwano river at Gonda district and Sarada river at Kheri district

Response:

- District authorities in Lucknow, Noida, Ghaziabad, Agra, Meerut, Aligarh, Mathura, Kanpur, Etah, Mainpuri and Firozabad have ordered closure of schools. All classes in schools across educational boards in these districts have been ordered to remain closed. In Aligarh, the schools have been closed till October 12.
- 10 teams of National Disaster Response Force has been deployed in Uttar Pradesh.
