### SITUATION UPDATE AND RESPONSE

## Situation in different state

- Rivers Godavari, Sabri, and Tungabhadra in Andhra Pradesh are flowing in severe flood situation in the districts of east godavari, Alluri Sitharama Raju and kurnool.
- Floods affected 61 villages in 15 districts of Madhya Pradesh.
- Districts of Tegangana in Godavari basin such as Bhadradi are in above normal flood situation with falling trend.
- Alert may be kept for water levels rise in river Narmada and its tributaries in Hardha, Hoshangabad and Betul districts
- 3939 populations have been affected during last 24 hrs in Andhra Pradesh

## Humanitarian Response

### Government Preparedness and Response

#### Situation in Gujarat:

- Water level in the Dev dam touched a level of 87.91 metres following heavy rainfall in the Panchmahal district, and hence water was released from four gates of the dam. Several villages in Waghodia, Dabhoi and Vadodara rural areas have been put on alert. Waghodia taluka in the Vadodara district received the highest rainfall since Monday at 91 mm, followed by Vadodara taluka at 85 mm, Padra with 67 mm, and Karjan taluka with 43 mm rainfall, while Dabhoi recorded 35 mm rain.
- Vadodara city remained on the edge Tuesday as the Vishwamitri river swelled up from 5.5 feet at 6 am to 15.5 feet at 5 pm, inching closer to 20 feet, in some parts.
- Ukai dam releases 1.88 lakh cusec water after increased inflow from upper catchment areas.

#### Situation in Madhya Pradesh:

- Intensity of rains which was witnessed over most parts of Madhya Pradesh have substantially reduced now. The only pockets that have seen rains in the past 24 hours have been West Madhya Pradesh.
- IMD has placed orange alerts over Vidarbha on Monday and over West Madhya Pradesh on Tuesday

#### Situation in Andhra Pradesh:

- Four persons died in last 24 hours, three in Alluri Sitarama Raju district and one in Eluru district, and one went missing in West Godavari district following unprecedented floods in the Godavari in Andhra Pradesh.

#### Situation in Telangana

- A total of 670 health workers were on Tuesday deployed for post flood management in addition to existing staff to conduct activities on a war footing basis.

#### Preparedness:

IMD has issued a warning of heavy to very heavy rainfall in Madhya Pradesh and Gujarat region and thunderstorm accompanied with lightning in coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam on 19th July 2022.

There are no red alerts issued by IMD for any districts in Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat, Andhrapradesh and Telangana from 20th to 23rd July, as of 19th July.

As per IMD, Fairly widespread/widespread light/moderate rainfall & thunderstorm/lightning very likely over Madhya Pradesh is predicted till 24th July 2022. Isolated heavy rainfall very likely over West Madhya Pradesh during 20th -23rd; East Madhya Pradesh on 20th & 23rd is predicted. Isolated very heavy rainfall also likely over West Madhya Pradesh on 19th and over East Madhya Pradesh on 21st & 22nd July, 2022 is predicted. Scattered to fairly widespread rainfall very likely over Gujarat State, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Telangana is predicted till 23rd July 2022



## Humanitarian Response

### Government Preparedness and Response

#### Response:

- One senior officer is appointed to every mandal for supervising the relief activities and separate teams have been constituted with medical, electricity and sanitation wings in every village in Telangana.
- Several teams have been deployed in Madhya Pradesh to rescue people caught in floods and take them to safe places.
- The Telangana government has taken up sanitation measures, distribution of essential items like rice, oil and red gram and other relief activities in the flood-hit areas
- The Union home ministry will send a high-level delegation to Telangana to assess the flood situation and losses.
- 15 teams of NDRF are deployed in Gujarat and 03 teams of NDRF are deployed in Madhya Pradesh assisting in rescue and relief operations.
- At least 811 people, including children and women were rescued and shifted to safer places in Gujarat flood.

### NGO Preparedness and Response

#### Response:

- Drones developed by the Chennai-based startup Garuda Aerospace are being used to drop food, water and other essential items In Andhra Pradesh and Gujarat, .
- Inter Agency Group - Gujarat is observing the situation and preparing for the responses in coordination with the member NGOs.
- Caritas India collect information from the field and identify immediate needs of the vulnerable Households of East Godavari and West Godavari districts covering 7 and 1 Mandal respectively. Caritas India plans to target 26 villages in East Godavari and 11 villages in West Godavari mainly of Tribal belt for its response.
