SITUATION UPDATE AND RESPONSE

Situation in Uttar Pradesh

- 1466 villages of 20 districts and 1328154 people in Uttar Pradesh are affected due to flood during the last 24 hrs.
- Incessant rains, swelling rivers, and floods have created havoc in most of the Terai regions of Uttar Pradesh
- 1045 people are evacuated during the last 24 hour
- Rapti river at Balrampur in BALRAMPUR district, Burhi Rapti river at Muhchurwa Ghat in Siddharth Nagar district, Kwano river at Dumari Ghat in BALRAMPUR district, and Ghagra river at Dhobahat in Ambedkar Nagar district are flowing in an extreme flood situation
- According to data shared by the relief commissioner's office in Lucknow on Tuesday, Balrampur has been identified as the worst-hit district with 287 flooded villages, followed by Siddharthnagar with 129 flood-hit villages.
- On Tuesday, three more people died in separate rain-related incidents across the state.
- While on Wednesday, there was some respite from rain that was continuing for the last four days, the floodwater released from the Nepal Dams has made the situation worse.
- The floodwater has swept away six people in the Balrampur district of UP, four in Gonda and two in Shrawasti. Of these, ten have died while two still missing.
- In Bareilly district, the discharge from Nepal dams has resulted in swelling of river Ramganga and 154 villages have been facing danger of flood.
- According to reports, rain has inundated thousands of hectares of crops like paddy, maize, bajra, urad, and potato across the state.
- In Sitapur district adjoining Lucknow the water released from the dams of Nepal has created havoc in hundreds of villages in three blocks.

Humanitarian Response

Government Preparedness and Response

Preparedness:

IMD has issued a warning of Shallow to moderate fog is likely to prevail at isolated pockets over East Uttar Pradesh at 13th morning.

CWC issued Extreme flood alert for Rapti river at Balrampur in BALRAMPUR district, Burhi Rapti river at Muhchurwa Ghat in Siddharth Nagar district, Kwano river at Dumari Ghat in BALRAMPUR district, and Ghagra river at Dhobahat in Ambedkar Nagar district in 12th October 2022

CWC also issued severe flood alert for Burhi Rapti river at Kakrahi in Siddharth Nagar district, Rapti river at Bansi in Siddharth Nagar district, Rapti river at Regauli in Gorakhpur district, Rapti river at Birdghat in Gorakhpur district, Ghagra river at Elginbridge in Barabanki district, Ghagra river at Ayodhya in Ayodhya district, Ghagra river at Turtipar in Ballia district, Sarada river at Paliakalan in Kheri district, Sarada river at Shardanagar in Kheri district, Rohin river at Trimohinighat in Maharajganj district, Ganga river at Kachhlabridge in Budaun district, and Kwano river at Chandradeepghat in Gonda district

Response:

- On Wednesday, Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath made an aerial survey of flood-affected areas in Balrampur, Shravasti and Gonda districts and directed officials to carry on relief work.
- 11 teams of National Disaster Response Force has been deployed in Uttar Pradesh.
- Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath chaired a high-level meeting on Wednesday, in the wake of widespread rainfall in the state, and directed his ministers to oversee relief and rescue operations in the districts under their charge.
- Budaun District Magistrate Deepa Ranjan said teams have been deployed to provide relief to people.
- Officials are also conducting survey to assess the crop damage after which farmers will be provided appropriate compensation.
- Community kitchen was organized from the point of view of flood in Nanpara Tehsil of district Bahraich.
- CM asked the officials to make the control rooms functional round the clock in the district and provide all possible help to the people.





Humanitarian Response

NGO Preparedness and Response

Response:

- **Inter Agency Group** - Uttar Pradesh is observing the situation and preparing for the responses in coordination with the member NGOs.
- An **Emergency coordination meeting** of IAG was conducted on 10th October 2022
- IAG – Uttar Pradesh with support of UNICEF and Sphere India has initiated **Joint Rapid Needs Assessment** in most affected districts.
- As an immediate measure, **World Vision India** is planning to reach about 3,584 households with immediate ready-to-eat food and will later support families with dry rations
- **UNICEF Uttar Pradesh and Action Aid** are in the ground helping the affected people in WASH
- **Samudaik Kalyan Evam Vikas Sansthan** is working on Food and Nutrition sector
- **Save The Children** is in the ground helping the affected people in Health sector
- **Gramin Baudhh Kalyan Sewa Sansthan Shravasti and Aim Trust** are in the ground helping the affected people in Education sector
- **Care India, CRS/GEAG, and Church's Auxiliary for Social Action (CASA)** are in the ground helping the affected people in Livelihood sector
- **PGVS and SSK** are in the ground helping the affected people
- Rescue & Relief Teams of Sashastra Seema Bal are rescued flood affected people in Uttar Pradesh
