SITUATION UPDATE AND RESPONSE

Situation in Uttar Pradesh

- 865 villages of 12 districts and 795807 people in Uttar Pradesh are affected due to flood during the last 24 hrs.
- 8658 people are evacuated during last 24 hour
- Rapti river at Balrampur in BALRAMPUR district, Burhi Rapti river at Parsohan Ghat in SIDDHARTH NAGAR district, Kwano river at Dumari Ghat in BALRAMPUR district, Suhali river at New Motipur in KHERI district, and Noon river at ORAI-2 Mangrayan in JALAUN district are flowing in an extreme flood situation
- The heavy rains over the state led to many traffic disruptions, and authorities shut down schooling for all classes up to class 12 until Wednesday.
- According to a report by the relief commissioner's office, the lives of around 8.43 lakh people have been impacted due to the floods.
- In Jhansi, seven people were killed in lightning strikes on Monday afternoon
- According to reports, rain has inundated thousands of hectares of crops like paddy, maize, bajra, urad, and potato across the state.
- The flood waters submerged the Gonda-Barhni-Gorakhpur railway bridge in Balrampur, affecting the movement of trains. According to Balrampur station superintendent P R Somvanshi, the movement of over two dozen trains was affected after the flood waters submerged the railway bridge.
- In Unnao, seven minors in the age group 7-17 were injured when a wall collapsed in Raghunathpur village in Bighapur tehsil due to heavy rains.
- Many homes are flooded and people are unable to cook, and they are unable to deliver groceries or food.
- Some displaced families are tied up under the open sky or living in high places which are in need of tarpaulin urgently

Humanitarian Response

Government Preparedness and Response

Preparedness:

IMD has issued a warning of Fairly widespread/widespread light/moderate rainfall with isolated/scattered heavy falls & thunderstorm/lightning very likely over, Uttar Pradesh on 11th October, 2022.

CWC issued Extreme flood alert for Rapti river at Balrampur in BALRAMPUR district, Burhi Rapti river at Parsohan Ghat in SIDDHARTH NAGAR district, Kwano river at Dumari Ghat in BALRAMPUR district, Suhali river at New Motipur in KHERI district, and Noon river at ORAI-2 Mangrayan in JALAUN district in 11th October 2022

CWC also issued severe flood alert for Ghagra river at Ayodhya in Ayodhya district, Ghagra river at Elginbridge in BARABANKI district, Ganga river at Kachhlabridge in BUDAUN district, Ghagra river at Turtipar in BALLIA district, Rapti river at Bansi in SIDDHARTH NAGAR district, and Kwano river at Chandradeepghat in GONDA district

Response:

- The state government has announced in an order that all higher educational institutions in the districts where the authorities have declared a holiday due to heavy rains will be closed. In view of the heavy rains, the District Magistrates of various districts have declared holidays for educational institutions.
- 10 teams of National Disaster Response Force has been deployed in Uttar Pradesh.
- Budaun District Magistrate Deepa Ranjan said teams have been deployed to provide relief to people.
- Officials are also conducting survey to assess the crop damage after which farmers will be provided appropriate compensation.
- Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath directed officials to speed up relief work in the districts affected by unseasonal rainfall.
- Community kitchen was organized from the point of view of flood in Nanpara Tehsil of district Bahraich.
