It's important to recognize that inequality and vulnerability to disasters are intertwined. Unequal access to essential services like finance and insurance leaves the most vulnerable exposed to disaster risks. Conversely, disasters often exacerbate existing inequalities and push those most at risk further into poverty. G20 New Delhi Leaders' Declaration on DRR also stressed the need to support and increase women's participation, partnership, decision-making and leadership in climate change mitigation and adaptation, and disaster risk reduction strategies and policy

This month has witnessed a significant focus on publications that provide guidance for mitigating various vulnerabilities and enhancing responses to these challenges. Of particular note is the growing emphasis on women-centric issues, with a strong emphasis on recognizing the intersectionality of these concerns. A landmark achievement in this regard was the passage of the reservation bill in Parliament, which represents a crucial step towards ensuring gender-specific representation and shattering the glass ceiling. Furthermore, the launch of the Menstrual Hygiene Scheme by the National Health Mission has played a pivotal role in promoting awareness of women's health and overall well-being.

Sharing some of the highlights from this month, we are happy to share on our continued efforts to monitor critical global discourses, documented through multiple knowledge resources disseminated on social media. In this September 2023 issue of Samanvay, we have aimed to encompass the various events, including the Global and National Programs, in collaboration with our members and partners. This issue also features our regular updates including Program Updates through all verticals, updates from Members and IAGs as well as global and national updates and Grant Opportunities.


Panel Discussion on Increasing Urban Resilience in the Context of Flooding in **Indian Cities**



On 14th Sep 2023, School of Planning and Architecture, New Delhi and Sphere India cohosted a session on Urban Flooding: Challenges and Way Forward with the increasing incidents of urban flooding in Indian cities. Some of the key insights shared reflected on the integration of traditional urban planning with adaptation and understanding the complexities of flood-resilient infrastructure, including underground reservoirs and flood-resistant transport which are crucial. As a way forward networks, prioritization of green and blue infrastructure was emphasized for promoting sustainability.

Programs Update

Inter-Agency Coordination



A total of seven situational reports were prepared, covering various hazards, including rainfall, floods, and landslides, each related to different locations in India. Among these reports, three focused on the situation in Manipur. Sphere India also addressed flood and lightning situations in different parts of India, including Assam, Madhya Pradesh, and Gujarat and lightning in Odisha during this period.

In response to the recent lightning incident in Odisha, Sphere India continuously monitored the ground situation in coordination with the IAG and subsequently developed and released one situation report. As part of our efforts to strengthen the IAG in Odisha and enhance capacity, Sphere India along with Climate Resilient Observing Systems Promotion Council (CROPC) and IAG Odisha organized an awareness session on the Zoom platform.

System Strengthening Efforts through Inter-Agency Group in Manipur

In Manipur, Sphere India facilitated district-level Inter-Agency Group (IAG) meetings in Kangpokpi, Imphal West, and Imphal East districts in September to gather updates and challenges from responding agencies. Government officials were also part of these meetings. Apert from that, we consistently updated the camp dashboard each week through continuous coordination with district coordinators. Furthermore, we conducted a thorough gap analysis by closely monitoring the real-time camp dashboard and subsequently released three situation reports.



Road Safety Device Use Case Evaluation: Engaging with Delhi Traffic Police



Sphere India has inititated a study focused on evaluating the utilization of road safety devices among road users in Delhi. As part of our engagement in this research, our team actively participated in a Road Safety event that took place on September 24, 2023, at Connaught Place.

This event was organized by the Delhi Traffic Police in collaboration with the Raahgiri Foundation. Our participation provided us with valuable insights into the initiatives undertaken by the Road Safety Department. Moreover, it facilitated meaningful connections with key authorities, setting the stage for forthcoming interviews and research endeavors

Collaborative Advocacy

Urban Dialogue: Policy Solutions for Adequate Housing to Build Inclusive and Resilient Urban

The urban dialogue was organised by Habitat for Humanity India in collaboration with UN-Habitat India, IFC -International Finance Corporation and Sphere India. It brought together experts, policymakers, and stakeholders to discuss innovative solutions for inclusive and resilient urban housing. The Dialogue emphasized the need for inclusive and resilient urban settlements and explored policy frameworks, innovative solutions, and collaborative partnerships to create sustainable housing ecosystems.



Settlements



The event commenced with the inaugural session emphasizing the importance of affordable housing, essential infrastructure, and service facilities in sustainable urban development. Key highlights included the Jaga Mission in Odisha, which aimed to empower slum dwellers by providing land rights and addressing financial gaps through Microfinance Institutions. Examples from Andhra Pradesh were also shared. Collaboration with Housing Finance Institutions was stressed, and global commitments in social inclusion and sustainable urban development were discussed

Knowledge and Capacity sharing

Training on Disaster Response for Procurement Officers of Tata Sustainability Group



Sphere India in collaboration with NIDM and Tata Sustainability Group organised a 4-day residential training program on disaster response for procurement officers of the Tata Group. The training involved 30 participants from various Tata Group companies engaged in procurement and logistics who will be trained for deployment during various disasters. The training on Day 1 was aimed exclusively for the new cadre who will be deployed during disasters. For the experienced cadre, the training was a refresher on SOPs and humanitarian principles during disasters.

Training on Mainstreaming of Animal Welfare in Disaster Risk Reduction



Sphere India in collaboration with Brooke India organised a training on Mainstreaming Animal Welfare in DRR for Brooke India's staff. This was a two-day online training for 35 participants. The training covered topics such as basic concepts of disaster management, relationship of animal welfare and DRR, techniques for animal handling during disasters, legal and policy framework for animal protection in DRR, LEGS framework, experience sharing by professionals engaged in animal rescue during disaster response, etc.

Education in Emergencies - Teachers as Catalysts for Resilient Education Systems



During times of disasters and conflicts, education often becomes the first casualty and the last to be restored. Education in Emergencies (EiE) plays a crucial role by providing stability, hope, and continuity of learning for children affected by crises, offering a sense of normalcy and opportunities for their future in adverse conditions. EiE also serves as a hub for various well-being services like healthcare, nutrition, hygiene, sanitation, and psychosocial support, benefiting not only students but also their families and communities. Recognizing the critical importance of addressing these challenges, Sphere India Academy, in collaboration with UNICEF India, organized an online session that delved into the pivotal role of teachers in education during emergencies, equipping them with the skills and knowledge needed to respond effectively to the unique challenges.

Preventing Snakebite Deaths: A DRR issue on International Snakebite Awareness Day

Snakebites are a significant public health concern in India, particularly affecting vulnerable groups like farmers and rural communities. The World Health Organization (WHO) has set a goal to reduce global snakebite deaths by half by 2030, highlighting the need for comprehensive prevention and emergency care strategies. In India, snakebiterelated fatalities are underreported but estimated at around 58,000 annually, with severe consequences such as amputations and disabilities. Access to affordable antivenom is limited, exacerbating the problem. To address this issue, Sphere India Academy, in collaboration with CARN-AP and PRISM, organized a session on "Preventing Snakebite Deaths: A DRR issue on International Snakebite Awareness Day" on September 19th, 2023. Speakers, including Dr. Aniruddha Dey, Prof. Farid Ahsan, Dr. Surajit Giri, Dr. Manjeet Kaur Bal, and Mr. Shibajee Mitra, discussed the global impact of snakebites, mitigation strategies, and knowledge exchange to foster collaborative solutions

Webinar: Resilience of Animals in the Face of Climate Change-Induced Disasters

Over the past decade, the frequency of disasters in India has increased, posing a significant threat to both humans and animals. India has a large livestock population, and disasters, such as floods, droughts, and cyclones, annually claim the lives of hundreds of animals. Recognizing the need for comprehensive disaster preparedness that includes animal welfare, Sphere India and Humane Society International/India organized an online discussion session titled "Building Resilience of Animals in the Face of Rising Disasters" on September 18th. During the session, Mr. Praveen S (Humane Society International/India) discussed the importance of improving disaster resilience for animals and Dr. K M Singh (Policy Perspectives Foundation) explored the effective strategies for animal inclusion in disaster management plans, aiming to promote the integration of animals in disaster management in India.




Carbon Pricing Metrics: Decarbonizing Pricing Approaches

Climate Action Tracker: Benchmarks for the Power System

Action The Climate Action Tracker (CAT) provides new 1.5°C compatible benchmarks for the



power sector, for the world as a whole and 16 countries, a mix of developed and developing. These are: Australia, Brazil, Chile, China, EU27, Germany, India, Indonesia, Japan, Mexico, Morocco, Türkiye, South Africa, the UAE, the UK, and the US., based on the methodology focus on what is needed to limit warming to 1.5°C and show how the shares of coal, fossil gas and renewables need to evolve out to 2050, and what this means for the emissions intensity of electricity generation, giving a roadmap for power sector decarbonisation. 

But local governments and municipalities must still provide services to their residents, and they need revenue to do so. The Early Warnings for All initiatives an ambitious push to ensure everyone on Earth is protected from hazardous weather, water, and climate events through life-saving early warning systems by the end of 2027.

Updates from Government

G-20 New Delhi Leaders Declaration 2023 During the recent G20 India Leaders' Meeting held in New Delhi from September 9th to 10th, 2023, leaders placed significant emphasis on unity, addressing global challenges, and the development of a human-centric global system. Key focus areas included sustainable development, gender equality, and tackling climate change. There was a recognition of being off-track in achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), accompanied by a commitment to accelerate their implementation.



The pivotal role of digital transformation in advancing the SDGs was acknowledged, along with a commitment to enhancing global food security and promoting sustainable food systems. Leaders also expressed awareness of potential macroeconomic impacts and pledged support for efforts aimed at mitigating food insecurity. Additionally, India's success in disaster risk reduction was highlighted, showcasing its early warning systems, disaster management plans, and resilient response to cyclones, emphasizing the importance of disaster resilience in the country

Aspirational Blocks Programme Portal and inaugurated the exhibition showcased on the occasion. Addressing the gathering, the Prime Minister noted the venue -Bharat Mandapam and the gathering people who are taking care of development in the far-flung areas. "It is an indication of the government's thinking that such a gathering is taking place at the venue of the G20 summit, where people deciding the direction of world affairs, gathered just a month ago", he said. The Prime Minister welcomed the ground-level change makers.

The Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi launched a unique week-long programme for Aspirational Blocks in the country called 'Sankalp Saptaah' at Bharat Mandapam, New Delhi. He also launched the

This dashboard offers more than 500 parameters, over 2000 infographics, and a number of interactive visualizations, allowing users to gain a holistic understanding of India's energy sector.

The scheme was initially implemented in 2011 in 107 selected districts in 17 States wherein a pack of six sanitary napkins called "Freedays" was provided to rural adolescent girls for Rs. 6. From 2014 onwards, funds are now being provided to States/UTs under National Health Mission for decentralized procurement of sanitary napkins packs for provision to rural adolescent girls at a subsidized rate of Rs 6 for a pack of 6 napkins. A range of IEC material has been developed around MHS, using a 360 degree approach to create awareness among adolescent girls about safe MH.

Swachhata Hi Seva (SHS) Campaign 3.0: Garbage Free India



Swachhata Hi Seva (SHS) 2023 campaign themed 'Garbage-Free India.' This year's campaign has identified several SBM activities which include cleaning of nearly 5300 beaches, revitalizing 4300 riverbanks and waterfronts, reclaiming over 10,700 legacy waste sites, improving 2400 tourist and iconic destinations, and restoring over 93,000 public spaces. Additionally, over 12,000 water bodies have been cleaned, over 60,000 institutional buildings rejuvenated, and nearly 47,000 garbage-vulnerable sites cleaned. These numbers reflect the unwavering dedication and the power of 'Jan Andolan' to bring about rapid transformation.





With the aim to take strict measures to control air pollution during the winter months in Delhi, when the air pollution significantly deteriorates, Commission for Air Quality Management in NCR and Adjoining Areas, CAQM held a review meeting on 26th September, 2023 with Chief Secretary Delhi, Chairperson NDMC, Principal Secretary Environment, Commissioner MCD, Commissioner, Transport and other Senior Officers of Govt. of NCT of Delhi including DPCC.
