




## **SITUATION REPORT-2**

# Cyclone Remal West Bengal

**Date: 27th May 2024 (Mon)** 

Time: 5:00 PM (IST)



#### SITUATION UPDATE AND RESPONSE

#### Overview:

Cyclone Remal lay centered at 01:30 hrs IST of today, the 27th May, 2024 over Coastal Bangladesh and adjoining Coastal West Bengal, near latitude 21.9°N and longitude 89,2°E about 115 km east of Sagar Islands (West Bengal), 105 km west-southwest of Khepupara (Bangladesh), 70 km southeast of Canning (West Bengal) and SO km south-southwest of Mongla (Bangladesh), The system would continue to move nearly northwards for some more time and then north-northeastwards and weaken gradually into a Cyclonic Storm by morning of May 27.

#### **Heavy Rainfall Warning:**

Light to moderate rainfall at most places with *heavy to very heavy rainfall* at a few places is likely over coastal districts of West Bengal and eastern districts of Gangetic West Bengal adjacent to Bangladesh on 27th May. The <u>peak rainfall activity is likely till noon of 27th May</u>. Light to moderate rainfall at most places likely over eastern districts of Sub-Himalayan West Bengal on 27th and 28th May. Damage Expected over South & North 24 Parganas, Howrah, Hoogly, Kolkata & adjoining East Medinipur districts of west Bengal. Kakdwip, Namkhana, Sagard Island, Diamond Harbour, Fraserganj, Bakkhali and Mandarmani.

# Damage Reports from the Ground:

- Deaths: 06 Nos. Kolkata (02), E. Bardwan (02), N 24 Pargana (01), S. Pargana (01)
- Train services in the suburban railways in the Sealdah section affected; Kolkata metro ran truncated services due to water logging at metro stations
- Embankment breaches at Sonaga Village (Gosaba) & Kalindi River (Hingalganj),
- Fallen electric poles and trees causing roadblocks & minor electricity disruptions.
- Damage to huts from fallen trees.
- Evacuation centers prepared but minimally used.
- Ongoing stormy winds and rain in affected areas.

#### **GOVERNMENT PREPAREDNESS & RESPONSE**

- NDRF Involvement: 02nd Battalion actively monitoring and addressing damage; Clearing roads, cutting trees, and sharing contact numbers for all blocks.
- The state government has initiated relief operations, providing food, drinking water and medical assistance to the people affected.
- The administration has shifted 2,07,060 people to the 1,438 safe shelters, at the moment there are 77,288 people. There are 341 gruel kitchens being operated at the moment.
