



It highlights how humanitarian needs evolved in 2022 and the ensuing repercussions for 2023, amid escalating food insecurity, the compounding impacts of climate change, and the ongoing fallout from the war in Ukraine. Furthermore, the report scrutinizes the flows of official development assistance (ODA) allocated for development, humanitarian, and peacebuilding responses in countries affected by crises. This includes financing aimed at mitigating the impacts of climate change and funding dedicated to disaster risk reduction. available datasets to delve into women's experiences in conflict. It showcases their opinions and stories, emphasizing the critical role of their leadership in helping communities survive

Global Humanitarian Overview 2024, Mid year Update: In the first six months of 2024,

Palestinian Territory (OPT), Myanmar and Sudan, while climate shocks-including floods, cyclones and drought-caused loss of lives and livelihoods in multiple countries. New appeals and plans were launched in Bangladesh, Burundi, Zambia and Zimbabwe, with the Global Humanitarian Overview (GHO) now targeting 188 million people across 72 countries

crises. Since 2020, the surveys have covered 20,000 people, including 13,785 women. The report uses national-level data about women and women in conflict, drawing on articles and expertise from various published sources. Additionally, the report includes a media analysis of over 7.8 million articles published about conflicts between 2013 and 2023 to understand the current narratives of conflict.
