Floods in Madhya Pradesh

Date: 02nd August 2025

SITUATION UPDATE

- Several districts—including Districts under flash flood alert included Ashoknagar, Betul, Bhind, Datia, Dewas, Guna, Gwalior, Harda, Khandwa, Morena, Narmadapuram, Raisen, Rajgarh, Sehore, Shajapur, Sheopur, Shivpuri, and Vidisha experienced intense rainfall and river overflows, triggering widespread flood-like conditions from July 29th, 2025.
- As per IMD release on 2nd August, isolated heavy rainfall is forecast over Madhya Pradesh on 3rd and 4th August.
- In Raisen, the Betwa River overflowed, inundating fields, roads, temples, and bridges. Raisen recorded about 32 inches of rain in July, a record for the last decade.
- As of 31st July 2025, DM Morena reported that 365 people were evacuated to relief camps (3 operational), rescue operations were ongoing at 5 locations, and 6 culverts were closed to traffic.
- As of 31st July 2025, Guna city remains heavily inundated with Cantt area and New City Colony severely impacted; rescue teams have evacuated trapped residents, the Kalora Dam in Fatehgarh has been damaged causing panic in nearby villages, the district hospital is flooded, the Kudka river bridge in Bamorri is damaged disrupting connectivity between Fatehgarh and Padon, Jhagar and Bhaunra rivers are in spate cutting off main roads to Rajasthan, and the Sindh river at Laharghat is flowing above the danger mark, leading to closure of the Guna-Kota road due to broken bridges.

In Shivpuri, Sankhya Sagar Lake at Madhav Tiger Reserve breached its limits after three consecutive days of heavy rainfall. The
overflow has been attributed to a cyclonic circulation over central Madhya Pradesh, as per IMD scientist. The state has already
received 60% more rainfall than its average.

Government Response

- The Chief Minister is closely monitoring the situation and has directed all officials, including district collectors and police, to take immediate action.
- A 24/7 Situation Room has been set up at the Mantralaya, and a toll-free helpline (1079) is operational for public assistance.
- Five NDRF teams have been deployed in Bhopal, Jabalpur, Gwalior, and Dhar, rescuing 22 people so far. The State Disaster Emergency Response Force (SDERF) has activated 259 disaster response centers and 111 Quick Response Teams in high-risk areas.
- Since June 1st, SDERF has conducted 432 rescue operations, saving 3,628 people and 94 animals.
- Thousands of trained "Disaster Mitra" volunteers are supporting local relief and rescue efforts across the state.
- As per media reports, the state has already distributed ₹28.49 crore in relief funds to affected populations.
