Uttar Pradesh Flood

SITUATION UPDATE

- Over the past 24 hours, at least 12 fatalities have been reported in Uttar Pradesh due to incidents related to flooding, lightning, drowning, and snake bites, as incessant rainfall continues to affect several regions.
- Seventeen districts have been severely impacted by the floods, including Kanpur Nagar, Lakhimpur Kheri, Agra, Auraiya, Chitrakoot, Ballia, Banda, Ghazipur, Mirzapur, Prayagraj, Varanasi, Chandauli, Jalaun, Kanpur Dehat, Hamirpur, Etawah, and Fatehpur.
- As of now, floods have affected 37 tehsils and 402 villages, impacting a total
 of 84,392 people. Approximately 4,015 hectares of agricultural land have
 been submerged. Furthermore, 343 houses have been damaged, and
 compensation has been provided to 327 families.
- According to data from the Uttar Pradesh Irrigation and Water Resources
 Department, the Ganga River is flowing above the danger level in Prayagraj,
 Mirzapur, Varanasi, Ghazipur, and Ballia. Similarly, the Yamuna River is at or
 above the danger mark in Auraiya, Jalaun, Hamirpur, Banda, and Prayagraj.
 The Betwa River is above the danger level in Hamirpur, while the Chambal
 River is rising dangerously along the Uttar Pradesh–Rajasthan border.
- Relief and rehabilitation efforts are ongoing. A total of 905 flood shelters have been made operational in the affected areas, where 11,248 displaced individuals have been accommodated. In addition, 757 health teams are actively conducting medical check-ups, and 1,193 flood posts have been established to monitor and respond to the evolving situation.
- In Prayagraj, floodwaters have risen nearly one meter above the danger level, submerging 84 ghats, roads, and residential areas. This has disrupted essential activities, including the performance of last rites at Rasulabad Ghat. Thousands of residents have been displaced, many of whom were forced to evacuate through waist-deep water, often carrying infants on their shoulders to reach safety.
- In Varanasi, more than 1,469 farmers have suffered losses, with approximately 327.9 hectares of cropland inundated. A total of 6,583 people have been displaced in the district and are receiving assistance in 20 relief camps. On a single day, over 17,000 food packets were distributed to the affected population, and more than 50 boats have been deployed for relief and rescue operations.

Government Response

- The Chief Minister has directed all concerned officials to undertake effective and timely flood relief operations across the affected regions.
- Furthermore, a high-level 11-member ministerial committee (Team-11), constituted by the Chief Minister to oversee the flood response and relief activities, visited the affected regions on Sunday, marking their presence at Ground Zero to assess the situation firsthand and provide necessary guidance to field-level officials.
- In compliance with this directive, the respective district administrations have provided relief assistance to 47,906 individuals and successfully relocated 2,759 cattle to safer locations. A total of 439 boats and motorboats have been deployed to facilitate the distribution of relief supplies and assist in rescue operations.
- Personnel from the NDRF, SDRF, and Provincial Armed Constabulary (PAC) have been mobilized and are actively engaged in rescue and evacuation efforts in the flood-affected areas.
- As part of the food and nutrition response, the administration has distributed 6,536 food packets and 76,632 lunch packets among the affected population. In addition, 29 community kitchens (langars) have been established to ensure the continued supply of hot meals to displaced individuals.
- For the welfare of livestock, approximately 500 quintals of fodder have been distributed in the flood-hit areas. To prevent the outbreak of water-borne diseases, the health department has distributed 1,29,571 chlorine tablets and 37,089 Oral Rehydration Solution (ORS) packets.
